The steamer Africa, from Liverpool at nine o'clock on the morning of the 6th, and Queenstown on the 7th.

The Africa has fifty-six passengers and \$2,500 in specie for Boston.

Queen Victoria's speech is said to have caused the most bitter disappointment in Denmark.

All the English journals treat matters as very undecided.

The buoyancy of English funds under the pacific Parliamentary debates continued.

The steamer Alabama, on the 5th of January, was fifty miles south of Rangoon.

The Liverpool Chamber of Commerce have been discussing the alleged system of nominally transferring American ships to the British flag.

The project of law abolishing the tobacco contract had been presented to the Cortes of Portugal.

The Bombay mail of January 14 had reached England.

The Africa makes the following report.—On the 9th inst., in latitude 50, longitude 18, passed a screw steamer.

The steamer Glasgow, from New York, also arrived at Liverpool on the evening of the 3d inst.

The steamer Teutonia, from New York, arrived at Southampton on the morning of the 4th inst.

The steamer Scotia, from New York, arrived at Liverpool on the 6th inst.

ADDITIONAL DETAILS OF THE ATTACK ON MISSUNDE GIVE THE FOLLOWING PARTICULARS.—

The loss of the Danes in the attack on Missunde was from one hundred and fifty to two hundred men.

The storming was attempted by the Prussians, but they were repulsed, the Danes maintaining a heavy fire against the storming party.

According to one account, one Prussian regiment was totally destroyed by the fire of the Danes.

The Prussians retired to Eickendorff.

On the afternoon of the 5th instant the Austrians attacked Buzorf, one mile south of Schleswig.

Another attack was expected on the 4th instant.

The King of Denmark was at Schleswig, and walked towards the outpost during the fighting at Buzorf.

An attack on the whole Danish line, from the town of Jagel, was expected to take place on the 4th instant.

The Prussian headquarters were at Kropp.

The Austrian vanguard, led by General Von Glatzner in person, with the vanguard of the Prussian Guards, advanced against Schleswig.

The attack was continued on the 4th instant, without making much impression on the Danish lines.

One grenade fell into the town of Schleswig, but the town itself was barricaded against a coup de main.

The King of Denmark had left Schleswig and arrived at Sonderburg.

A false guide conducted the Prussians against the Austrians and they fired upon each other.

On the 5th inst., a heavy fall of snow prevented much activity among the opposing forces, but there was some firing in the vicinity of Schleswig.

The Danes had altogether about a thousand men de camped at Schleswig, fifty—300 killed and wounded and 700 left in imminent danger.

The loss of the Austrians, at the latest date, was thirty officers and 519 men.

It is reported that the Danes have sent cruisers after Prussian vessels.

Duke Frederick has been proclaimed at Eickendorff and Schwanen, in Schleswig.

The Austrian Reichsrath had expressed its sympathy for the army in Schleswig, and granted an extraordinary credit of four millions of florins.

A semi-official Vienna paper expresses the hope that the explanations just sent by Austria and Prussia to England will avoid all further complications.

The London Times says:—The British government is

On the 2d of February the Austrian army attacked Buzorf at three o'clock in the afternoon, when endeavoring to force its way to and behind the Dannerwerk.

Here they were met by the Danes in a very spirited manner, and severe fighting continued until darkness set in and for some time afterwards.

The Danes held their ground with the latest despatch, dated at half-past one o'clock in the evening of the 3d instant, was forwarded.

The King of Denmark, who was stationed inside of the Dannerwerk, walked forth to witness the conflict.

A number of wounded men were being brought into the town of Schleswig from Buzorf.

It was expected that another attack would be made on the place.

Our latest news brought by the Africa to Halifax, dated in London to the 7th instant, do not inform us of the result of the first engagement at Buzorf, now known as the battle of Buzorf.


