WASHINGTON, March 10, 1864.

SENATOR POMEROY'S SPEECH.

The war of the chase was inaugurated upon the floor of the Senate to-day by the open declaration of war upon the Lincolnists by Senator Pomeroy. He frankly avowed the authorship of the celebrated circular, and defended it. The speech was mild, but it produced a great sensation, as it was regarded as the opening of the Senatorial career for the Baltimore nomination. The speeches of Messrs. Wilkinson and Lane in reply were very stirring, and elicited much feeling. Many partisans on both sides were present to hear the debate. The speech of General Pomeroy is regarded as a complete refutation of the story in circulation that Mr. Chase has declined to be a candidate for the Presidency. It is probable that he may have written that he is not an aspirant for that position; but it is evident that republican Senators and members of Congress who are known to have the confidence of the Secretary of the Treasury, and are in constant communication with him, are determined, if possible, to procure his nomination at Baltimore.

THE SURPLUS GOLD QUESTION.

The Gold bill was discussed quite briefly in the Senate to-day, and made the special order for to-morrow at half-past twelve. From the disposition manifested by the Senate, it is regarded as certain that the amendment of Mr. Sherman, authorizing the Secretary of the Treasury to stop the gold, will be adopted.

THE SHIP CANAL IN THE HOUSE.

Mr. Arnold, of Illinois, introduced, against determined opposition, in getting the bill for the construction of a ship canal connecting the Mississippi river and Lake Michigan before the House, and it will come up again next week on its merits. There is so much opposition to it, and the Northwestern members evidently being divided upon it, there is little probability of its passage by the House. It is substantially the same bill reported last session, but upon which no final action was reached.

THE CONFERENCE ON THE DEFICIENCY BILL.

The Conference Committee on the Deficiency Bill are said to be struggling over an item in the appropriations for the War Department of one hundred and eighteen thousand dollars for women. No other department has asked for such an appropriation, and it is considered at least a superfluous appropriation.

THE GOVERNORS OF THE UPPER POTOMAC AND THE CHESAPEAKE AND OHIO CANALS.

Information has been received here from the Upper Potomac that the rebel guerrillas who have menaced the line of the canal and railroad have retired, and that Barry, Imboden, and Jones have gone southward, probably to strengthen the army of Lee. So little apprehension of interruption is now entertained that the water will be let into the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal in a few days, and the coal trade resumed. Immense preparations have been made for this trade, both by rail and coast, the American and Central Coal Company, of New York, having engaged nearly all the boats that can be procured.

A RAVAL BROOMING-ROOM OF THE BAPTIST CHURCH.

Arrived from the Lower Potomac report an expedition up the Rappahannock last Monday. A number of gunboats went up about thirty miles, throwing shells into every locality where rebels might be concealed, but without discovering any force of the enemy.

THE TWELVE SURVIVING REVOLUTIONARY PENSIONERS.

The unanimous passage by the House to-day of the bill increasing the pensions of the twelve surviving Revolutionary pensioners gave universal satisfaction, and was regarded by all parties as only a just recognition of the services of these patriots, who deserve that the brief remnant of their lives shall want no comfort which a grateful country can afford.

THE GOODYEAR PATENT REMONSTRANCE.

The remonstrance against the extension of Goodyear's India rubber patent, presented by Mr. Sumner to-day, and signed by the leading manufacturers of Lowell, reports that investigations are being prosecuted concerning the license issued under the old patent, and ask that action upon the subject be delayed by the Senate until April 10. It is believed that the extension of the patent will not be granted.

SUPPOSED REBEL REPRODUCTION IN THE DEAD BODY OF COLONEL DALRYMPLE.

INFORMATION FROM THE UNITED STATES AND GREAT BRITAIN FOR THE SETTLEMENT OF THE CLAIMS OF THE BRITISH BY AND AGAINST AGRICULTURAL COMPANIES HAS JUST BEEN EXCHANGED.

All questions between the United States authorities on the one hand, and the Hudson Bay and Puget Sound Agricultural Companies on the other, with respect to the possessory rights and claims of these companies, and of any other British subjects in Oregon and Washington Territories, are to be settled by the transfer of these rights and claims to the government of the United States for an adequate money consideration. And it is agreed that the United States shall have the right to purchase the lands of the British within twelve months after the exchange of ratifications of the present treaty, upon such a commission for the purpose of examining and deciding upon all claims arising out of its provisions.
