ALL THE REBELS ASKED FOR WAS AN ARMISTICE. There is no truth whatever in the statement extensively circulated that the rebel commissioners demanded recognition, and refused to enter into negotiations except on that basis.

THE PRESIDENT'S THREE POINTS. The President and Mr. Seward refused to grant an armistice for a single day. Mr. Lincoln informed them that there were three points which he would not yield.

THE SOUTHERN VERSION OF THE RESULTS ATTAINED. Mr. Lincoln insisted that reunion should be the basis of settlement, and that a united country should be the result of all negotiations.
