MONDAY, Feb. 20-3 P. M. The stock market was heavy at the first board, with the exception of Cumberland Coal, which was excited and seven per cent higher at the close than at Saturday's board.

At the second board at one o'clock the market was a fraction higher. At the second regular board it was dull. The closing sales showed a decline from the morning prices in Erie & N. Y., Fort Wayne & N. Y., Michigan Southern, Illinois Central, Northwestern, Rock Island and New York Central were unchanged.

Moreover, the demand for our national securities in Europe is largely assisting the effect of the preponderance of our exports over our imports by correspondingly diminishing the demand for gold for export and bills of exchange.
