By this arrival we have received information of the suspension of the habeas corpus in Ireland and the virtual opening of the Fenian rebellion.

Diplomatic relations had entirely ceased between Russia and the Papal Court.

Some interesting experiments had been tried on board the Great Eastern with Mr. Willoughby Smith's new system for the insulation of telegraph cables.

It is stated that by this system a perfectly continuous telegraph maintained during the laying of the cable, so that any loss of insulation or situation of continuity of the conductor is instantly detected on board the vessel even during the time that messages are being transmitted from ship to shore, or vice versa.

In the event of injury to the cable while in the tank the discovery would be so prompt that the paying out would be stopped before it was possible that the injured portion could pass over the paying out wheel into the sea.

The Paris Press says that the new Peruvian frigate Hunzar, lying at Brest, had enlisted French sailors, but they were subsequently disembarked at the request of the authorities.

A telegram from Portugal, dated the 15th ult., announces that the American squadron has sailed for the Mediterranean.

A letter from Rome says that it is believed that at the next Consistory a bishop of the United States will receive a cardinal's hat.

A large meeting has been held at Exeter Hall, under the auspices of the Freedmen's Aid Society, to celebrate the passage of the Constitutional Amendment act in America, and the consequent legal abolition of slavery.

The London Times gives great prominence to a letter urging a modification of the reform question, on the part of the politicians in reference to the measure, and Parliament has to consider many other matters of pressing importance.

He briefly explained that the government had thought fit to briefly explain that the Legislature of Jamaica had arrived at, abolishing it, and it would be proposed to establish a government similar to that in Trinidad for a period of three years, and if the experiment was successful, then it would be made permanent; if not, some other arrangement would be devised.

The London Times states that Mr. Gladstone's budget will show an excess of income over the expenditure of about three millions sterling. It thinks Mr. Gladstone will attempt to reduce the national debt.
