

FINANCIAL AND COMMERCIAL.

SUNDAY, OCT. 21, 1896.

The past week witnessed great excitement on the Stock Exchange. It opened with a very buoyant tone on Monday, but after the morning board became rather weak and irregular in its movements.

The exports of gold and silver from this port and Boston since the beginning of May last have been as follows:

The California steamer, arrived yesterday, brought \$1,435,357 in treasure, making the receipts at this port \$34,300,967 against \$18,792,341 for the corresponding period in 1895.

The gold market was disturbed by the report concerning the government being a seller to which we have already referred, and the price declined from 153 1/2 on Monday morning to 146 on Saturday.

The foreign exchange market closed strong and excited on Saturday, and the disposition of the leading drawers was rather to advance than to relax their rates in view of the large foreign indebtedness of the country and the necessity under which importers will soon find themselves of making remittances to Europe.
