THE BAHAMAS. Terrific Hurricane at Nassau and the Out Islands—Hundreds of Dwellings, Churches, Warehouses and Stores Blown Down or Damaged—Two Thousand Persons Homeless—Serious Marine Losses and Many Lives Lost.

By the arrival of the Cunard steamship Cerberus at this port yesterday we have from the Bahamas dated at Nassau, N. P., on the 20th of October.

The papers contain very ample and melancholy details of the effects of the terrible hurricane which visited the islands on the 1st and 2d inst.—already referred to by telegraph in our columns—with reports of the marine and commercial losses sustained thereby.

His Excellency the Governor called a meeting of the Legislature October 9, for the purpose of consulting as to the best method of alleviating the distresses occasioned by the hurricane. Several vessels have been despatched from Nassau to the out-lands with provisions for the destitute.

The Nassau Guardian of the 20th of October reports her Britannic Majesty's ship Nimble still lies ashore on her starboard side, abreast of the Navy Yard. Her guns, ammunition and engines have been removed, and hopes are entertained of releasing her comparatively unharmed.

The most severe and disastrous hurricane ever felt in the islands—partial destruction of the City of Nassau.

It is our painful duty to record the most alarming hurricane which has visited Nassau within the memory of man. On Sunday morning, at eleven o'clock, the aneroid barometer at the Commodore's stood at 29.8, the wind whistling from the north. At half past nine, it fell to 27.7. There was a lull for nearly an hour and a half.

At half-past ten o'clock P. M. the wind sprang up from the opposite quarter—the southwest—and continued to increase in force until it attained a velocity when it gradually subsided. To give a correct account of property destroyed will be impossible until the returns are officially sent. The West Indians, we believe, have suffered most, their new and beautiful Trinity chapel, Frederick street, with its large and powerful organ, being entirely demolished, leaving only the walls and the roof standing. This lady edifice was blown down about three o'clock P. M.

The Council Chamber and House of Assembly have suffered badly as the result of the hurricane. Commencing from the Navy Yard, West Bay street (below which it was almost impossible to pass on account of the ruins of houses, boats, pieces of wrecks, broken up wharves, &c.) and proceeding in an easterly direction, we observed that the wharf of the Navy Yard was swept away; the bathing house of the Ordnance Department has shared the same fate; the out-buildings of the barracks have partially disappeared; the roof of the officers' quarters and that of the eastern iron barracks have been torn up. Mrs. T. Farrington's house on the southern wharf, &c., and proceeding in an easterly direction, we observed that the wharf of the Navy Yard was swept away; the bathing house of the Ordnance Department has shared the same fate; the out-buildings of the barracks have partially disappeared; the roof of the officers' quarters and that of the eastern iron barracks have been torn up.

At the corner of Bay and West Bay streets, the house of Messrs. Henry Adderley & Co. Bay street, was blown down; the warehouse of Messrs. A. Johnson & Co. Bay street, was blown down; the shop of Mrs. George Adderley, has fallen to the ground; the shops of Mr. Quinton, Mr. Charles, Mr. Robert, Mr. Herbert, Messrs. J. C. Ralston, Mr. W. B. Squire, Messrs. Squire, Brox, have been unroofed and otherwise seriously damaged. All the wharves on the north side of the harbor, the slaughter house and market fish shed are no more.

The New Providence Asylum has suffered considerably, and the quarantine buildings are levelled to the ground. The houses and out-buildings in the rear of the Hon. G. D. Harris' residence are in a woful plight. Chief Justice Doyle has lost a considerable amount in the destruction of his property. The house of Mr. Esq. Bay street, has been partially destroyed. The warehouse of Messrs. H. R. Saunders & Co., at the corner of Bay and West Bay streets, has lost its roof, and the wharves on the water side, have lost their roofs. St. George's Hall, with the wharves in the rear, have been destroyed; in fact, the hurricane has done a fearful work. The fore-mentioned, have been destroyed of them. Major Cumberland's house in West Hill street had its roof carried away and lodged near the gateway of Judge Doyle's residence. The house of Mr. J. A. Brook and Mr. J. H. Webb, in the same street, were partially unroofed, the inmates taking refuge at the corner of Duke and Cornhill streets. The Baptist chapel (Zion), in Shirley street, is divided of its portion. St. Anne's church at Sandlands is unroofed.

We have only heard of the loss of two lives; one that of Mr. Abraham Adderley, who was knocked down by the falling of a house in the Middle road, All Saints Town, and the other that of Mrs. W. B. Squire, who was killed by the falling of a house in the rear of the Infant Public School. Teacher, Mr. Horton, crushed to death by her falling house.
