

FINANCIAL AND COMMERCIAL.

THE stock market was firm at the commencement of business this morning, but subsequently it became feverish, under sales to realize, of which there are generally more than usual on Saturday. At the same time, disquieting rumors from Baltimore were circulated, and these were not without transient effect. After two o'clock, however, more buyers than sellers appeared, and the speculative feeling was strong. All the leading railway shares advanced, and particularly Northwestern and Erie, the former recovering to 60 1/4 and the latter to 84 1/4. The course of Northwestern was excited and irregular during the last few days, but the speculative interest in it is very keen, and the large earnings of the road tempt buyers. The fourth week of October was \$28,972, showing a \$303,960 for the corresponding week last year, against an increase of \$90,012. The number of outside speculators, both in the city and throughout the country is still receiving fresh accessions, and the volume of transactions daily is equal to that of the most exciting periods of 1893 and 1894. Probably more than half of these are mercantile men, who have been induced by the dulness of trade to direct their attention to the Stock Exchange. The "bullish" temper of the street is undiminished, and the bull operators have gained so much strength by their continued successes that they hold the market entirely under their control, and are likely to do so until there is some material change in the conditions of monetary affairs, which is not likely to take place within the present year at least.

The heavy business on the stock exchange, has naturally created an increased demand for money, and has advanced the rate for call loans to five per cent on railway stocks, and four on government, but the supply of capital offering is in excess of the wants of borrowers, and first class houses are in some instances able to borrow at 3 3/4. There is no new feature in the monetary aspect at the West. The Chicago Tribune of Thursday reported "the market is easy for prime business paper at ten per cent," while the Cincinnati Commercial of the same date remarked: "The demand for discounts is still good, and the market is gradually working closer; supply of currency, however, is sufficient for all legitimate purposes, and first class business men experience no difficulty in negotiating loans."
