The ministerial Berlin Correspondence says the publication of the treaties between Prussia and the South German States was not intended as a demonstration against foreign Powers.

The relations of Prussia with France are especially satisfactory, and the publication of the treaty does not have any other object than to reassure the North German States.

The German policy of the Prussian government, the same paper, speaking of the negotiations between Holland and Prussia relative to Luxemburg, says that the initiative in this matter came from the Dutch government.

The British government was arrested daily, by order of the British government, at Queenstown.

Christian Organization Against Turkey in Europe—Bulgarian Demands on the Sultan—The Porte Likely to Yield—Preparing for War—Russia and Prussia Prepared to Revitalize—Turkey, Austria and Russia Moving their Troops.

Intelligence of an important character began to come from the Christian communities of Turkey in Europe, showing the imminence of a very general revolution in that region.

It is now announced that treaties of alliance have been entered into by Serbia, Bulgaria, Montenegro and Greece, by which they engage to support each other in an effort to expel the Mussulmans from Europe.

This information fully bears out the statements of your St. Petersburg correspondent, made weeks ago, in relation to Eastern affairs, and coming events will further justify his repeated predictions that a general uprising will take place in all the Turkish possessions on this continent before the summer comes.

The secret Central Committee of Bulgarians has just sent to the Sultan a petition, in which it asks the "very gracious master and father" to proclaim the autonomy of Bulgaria, and submits the basis on which the people desire the act.

First—They demand a national and constitutional government.

Second—Bulgaria, with all the provinces inhabited by the Bulgarians, shall form a State, under the domination of the Kingdom of Hungary.

Third—The Sultan shall abdicate in favor of "Sultan of the Ottoman," that is King of Bulgaria.

Fourth—The Sultan shall be crowned as king in one of the ancient capitals of the kingdom.

Fifth—The Kingdom shall be governed by a Christian National Assembly, elected by the National Assembly, and composed of the votes of the Bulgarian people.
