Despatches from the Scene of Action.

By mail from Japan we have despatches at Yokohama on the 14th of March, reporting the progress of the civil war, with the following highly interesting account of the exciting causes of that event, written in English by a native.

Native History of the War.

From the Japan (Yokohama) Times, March 14. It is now about a month and 2 1/2 years Tokugawa has been Taikun in Japan.

At the last Tokugawa Taikun thought that he might be able to get the Japanese people to follow him in his country, because there were many large Daimios who could not command anything else but their own lands.

Afterwards it was commanded by Mikado to the Prince Tokugawa that he would give back to Mikado the Brevets, Yokohama, Nagasaki, Hakodate, Higo and other places.

On the 23rd January last there was a large battle between Prince Tokugawa and Satsuma.

The Satsumans knew that they could not fight with the said Mikado without any help or trick, and they have brought from Koto the colors of Mikado, on which the Satsumans were to fight against him.

By this color being seen of the Satsumans, they thought it was right to help the Satsumans, for the Emperor had been taken to Koto, and among others, the Emperor's chief, and the Daimios took and all the other armies were taken to him; and they were more stronger than before.

As this was the case of many people of Prince Tokugawa he came back to Yedo and the city Osaka has been plundered by the Satsumans and Choshu.
