The steamer Moro Castle, Captain Adams, from Havana June 13, arrived at this port yesterday afternoon.
The Congressional appropriations for military purposes during the year amount to \$4,448,001, and for all other purposes to \$10,220,000, being altogether \$14,668,001. The resolution to appoint commercial agents in Europe was voted down on the score of economy. An appropriation was made for the partial cancellation (amortization) of the copper currency issued by Juarez in 1865, in Chihuahua, at a face value greatly beyond its true value.

Before adjourning Congress selected a standing committee, composed of one member for each State, to sit during the recess. This committee has chosen Senator Yell for its chairman, Senator Davis Vice chairman and Mr. Barnd and Asaonsa Secretaries. It has appointed a sub-committee to investigate the charges made against Frigoyen, the conservative candidate for Governor of Yucatan, of having sold on the 29th ult., on his way to the capital, to defend himself against the accusations made. Congress also acceded to the wishes of a large number of the citizens of the State of Mexico, and by a vote of 109 to 12 passed a law dividing the State into two States, the new one to be called Hidalgo. Pacheco is proposed as the capital.
