ENGLAND.

Important Speech by Mr. Disraeli on Finance, Public Education and the Irish Church.

LONDON, Nov. 19, 1868.

The Right Hon. Benjamin Disraeli made a speech to-day to his constituents at Aylesbury. After returning his acknowledgments for their unanimity in supporting him to the House of Commons, he proceeded to review and justify the action of the conservative party on the reform question. He then defended the government from the charge of extravagance. The expenditures were large; the government could not be conducted cheaply, but he maintained that the financial management had been in every sense economical. He advocated the extension of education and favored the creation of a Department of Public Instruction. With a Cabinet Minister at its head, but insisted that neither a compulsory educational system nor the imposition of a new tax for educational purposes was in accordance with the opinion of the country. He then contrasted the foreign policy of the proceeding with that of the present ministry. The relations which now existed with foreign Powers were those of confidence and sympathy, and all the disagreements with the United States were now removed. He concluded with a discussion of the Irish question. The resolutions for the disestablishment of the Irish Church introduced by the leader of the opposition could not mitigate the evils of Fenianism. The troubles of Ireland were greatly exaggerated. Ireland had really progressed within the last twenty years more than England. Disestablishment was dangerous to the rights of property; it would only serve to increase the discontent of the Irish people, while at the same time it would be sure to sever the connection between the State and religious principle.

THE PARLIAMENTARY ELECTIONS—LIBERAL MAJORITY.

The Times this morning states that 376 members of the new House of Commons have been chosen so far and that the liberal majority is 115.

Weekly Statement of the Bank of England.

LONDON, Nov. 19, 1868.

The regular weekly statement of the Bank of England, made public to-day, shows that the amount of bullion in vault has decreased £1,000,000 sterling since last week.

Rise in the Rate of Discount.

LONDON, Nov. 19—Noon.

The Bank of England has raised its rate of discount to two and a half per cent. The rate has been two per cent since July, 1867.

Additional Election Returns and Liberal Majority.

LONDON, Nov. 19—10 P. M.

According to the returns received up to this hour, 437 members of the House of Commons have been elected, of whom 287 are liberals and 150 conservatives.

THE DEPARTURE OF GENERAL GRANT.

PARIS, Nov. 19, 1868.

Parauat to the announcement in the HERALD the President-elect left the Metropolitan Hotel yesterday at twelve o'clock, and with Mrs. Grant and the members of his staff took a carriage and drove to the foot of Cortlandt street and booked for Philadelphia. It was the earnest desire of Messrs. George H. Stuart, William B. Mann and other prominent citizens of the latter city that the General would stop there on his way to Washington, and in pursuance of that wish the President-elect consented to sojourn for a while in the Quaker City. He will probably be the guest this evening of the Loyal League Club of the Quaker City.

SPAIN.

General Prim Proposes the Prince of Asturias for the Throne.

MADRID, Nov. 19, 1868.

It is rumored that General Prim is negotiating with the Prince of the Asturias with the intention of making the Prince King of Spain and himself Regent.

NORTH CAROLINA.

The Congressional Delegation—The Seventh District to be Contested.

RALPHIGH, Nov. 19, 1868.

Semi-official returns from the Seventh district indicate the election of Durham, democrat, to Congress by a majority of eighteen in the twenty counties. The vote of Yancy county, however, received yesterday, the last day, in informal, and will probably be thrown out, which would elect Jones, republican, by a majority of fifty-four. Both candidates claim to be elected, and either will contest the seat of the other on the grounds of fraud on the one hand and intimidation of voters on the other. The matter will come before the Council of State, which meets on Saturday, and which will probably decide that the vote of Yancy county is illegal, and thus secure the seat for Jones. Congress will have to decide which candidate is elected in the end. The Congressional delegation is politically the same as in the last Congress, six republicans and one democrat, the latter, Shober, from the sixth district.

PARAGUAY.

General Martin McBain, Minister to Paraguay and the Waashura Imbroglia.

LONDON, Nov. 19, 1868.

At latest dates received from South America General Martin McBain, the new American Minister to Paraguay, remained at Rio Janeiro, where he awaited instructions from his government as to what action to take in regard to the outrage of the Paraguayan government upon the American Legation at Asuncion.

CUBA.

Colonel Cespedes Provisional President—Orders for a Conscription—Pueyo Principe Fallen—Rebel Victory at Jilana.

HAVANA, Nov. 18, 1868.

From revolutionary sources we learn that Colonel Cespedes is acting as Provisional President, in the absence of Colonel Aguilera. He has issued a decree ordering all citizens between the ages of eighteen and forty to be enrolled for active service, under penalty, in case of failure, that they be declared enemies. All native male persons between the ages of forty and sixty must do "home guard" duty. Lieutenant General Marceno commands the Eastern Department, Aguero the Central, the other chiefs being Miral, Sanchez, Berdo and Peralta. The latest news by telegram, received last night from Puerto Principe, announces that the government troops were besieged with the Governor in a convent had surrendered to the insurgents. At Jilana the insurgents whipped the troops.

THE NEW DOMINION.

Financial Excitement in New Brunswick—Arrest of a Banker—Bank Suspension.

ST. JOHN, Nov. 19, 1868.

Yesterday was a day of panic and disorder. Nothing like it was ever known before in St. John. Early in the day it became known that St. J. Scovill, the agent of St. Stephen's Bank, had failed. He had for some years been doing a large private banking and exchange business in this State. His liabilities are supposed to be about \$200,000. He is now in jail, where he is accumulating against him. The St. Stephen's Bank, which is now in liquidation, had about \$1,000,000 in deposits, when the St. Stephen's Bank suspended.

Arrest of a Pretended Government Agent.

TORONTO, Nov. 19, 1868.

A man named Joseph Nelson, who has lately obtained considerable notoriety by bringing extraordinary charges against Mr. Bridges, manager of the Grand Trunk Railway, was arrested here, at the instance of parties from New York, on a charge of fraudulently representing himself as agent of the Canadian government and procuring a large quantity of coal.

Scarcity of Shipping at Quebec—Heavy Fall of Snow.

QUEBEC, Nov. 19, 1868.

The harbor is nearly bare of shipping, and but few arrivals or departures are taking place. The river is clear of ice except along the wharves.

NEW YORK.

The Colic-Hiscock Murder Trial—Opening for the Defence.

NEW YORK, Nov. 19, 1868.

The following witnesses for the prosecution were examined this morning—Egbert Whitaker, John H. Mann, George W. Atkins, Dr. James M. Arnsby, Ezra G. Treadwell. These are the same witnesses as on the previous trial. They prove the homicide, the nature of the wounds, the search of the prisoner and the finding of the pistol and the letters. William J. Hadley opened for the prisoner and to about the same effect as on the previous trial. James T. Brady appeared for the defence for the first time to-day. At the conclusion of Mr. Hadley's very elaborate opening the defence called Dr. Marcus M. Manly, who was surgeon of the Second United States colored cavalry during the war. This was the regiment commanded by General Cole. Dr. Manly testified to the nature of the injuries inflicted on the prisoner's bowels, occasioned by the falling of a horse upon him while in the service. He described the symptoms which attended the illness of General Cole, and cited acts which the witness regarded as so singular as to lead him to the conclusion that General Cole's mind had been disturbed and that the witness was a lunatic. The knife found on the prisoner was identified by the witness as belonging to a single individual, and the witness testified that he was cross-examined at great length by Mr. Tremaine as to his professional antecedents and his knowledge of the causes and character of melancholia and dementia. No other witness was called. Previous to the adjournment Judge Hogeboom suggested that for the purpose of saving time the testimony of witnesses should be taken by reading and sworn to by each of those witnesses as are recalled on this trial, and that such testimony be admitted as evidence. The witness for the defence, Mr. Hadley, for the defence, stated that they were willing to adopt this course. Counsel for the people will consider the matter and announce their decision to-morrow morning.

Sentence of a Murderer.

UTICA, Nov. 19, 1868.

The jury in the case of William Henry Carver, indicted for murdering Abby Elizabeth Sanders, a little girl only eight years and six months old, in the town of Lyons, in this State, returned a verdict of guilty. The evidence shows the murderer first despoiled his little victim and then brutally murdered her. Judge Morgan will sentence him at nine o'clock Friday morning.

ALABAMA.

Opening of the State Fair—Splendid Display of Stock and Goods—Election Returns.

MONTGOMERY, Nov. 19, 1868.

The first Alabama State fair held since 1860 commenced in this city yesterday. It is largely attended and many visitors from other States are present. The number of articles and stock exhibited is far beyond the expectations. The fair will continue two days longer and is looked upon as a grand success. The Legislature adjourns to-day on account of the fair and will probably do no business this week.

ILLINOIS.

The Billiard Contest at Chicago—Second Game Won by Rodolph—Election Returns.

CHICAGO, Nov. 19, 1868.

A second game of billiards between Rodolph and Carne was played to-night. The game was an American four ball game, push shots barred, 1,000 points, for \$1,000 a side. It was won by Rodolph on the sixty seventh inning. The score stood, Rodolph 1,000, Carne 750.

MISSOURI.

Cleveland Officials in St. Louis—Suit Against the Indianapolis and St. Louis Railroad.

ST. LOUIS, Nov. 19, 1868.

The Mayor and a committee of the City Council of Cleveland are on a visit to this city inspecting the public works and taking a general view of St. Louis. Fourteen new road-builders for the Iron Mountain Railroad arrived here to-day from Paterson, N. J. Mrs. Patti H. Johnson has commenced a suit against the Indianapolis and St. Louis Railroad Company for \$25,000, for alleged carelessness on the part of the employees of the company which resulted in the death of her husband, John Johnson, on the 15th of last August, at Mattou, Ill.

MARYLAND.

Arrival of Schuyler Colfax at Baltimore.

BALTIMORE, Nov. 19, 1868.

The Hon. Schuyler Colfax and lady arrived in this city this morning.

SHIPWRECKS.

The Loss of the Steamer Star of the Union—The Drowning of Messrs. Clark and Johnson—Loss of the Bark Anna.

HAVANA, Nov. 19, 1868.

Further particulars of the wreck of the steamer Star of the Union have been received. The steamer ran on Morill's Reef, about a mile from the shore, at half-past six o'clock Friday evening. The captain says in his report that it was raining hard, and that he was on that account deceived by the current. He saw a light on shore which he took for the one at Bahla Honda. The steamer lies where she struck, with her back broken. The cargo will be saved in a damaged condition if the sea remains calm. The hull and machinery will be a total loss. There was a very heavy sea with breakers when the steamer struck. A boat which put out was capsized by the surf while attempting to land and two persons—Mr. Clark, of San Francisco, and George Johnson, of Philadelphia—passengers, were drowned. Their bodies have not yet been recovered. The American was steamer Penobscot, which was wrecked on the coast of the assistance of the Star of the Union, and Captain General Lezard ordered the Spanish war steamer Francisco to assist in the rescue. These vessels offered every assistance possible, and returned to Havana this morning with the particulars given above.

FLORIDA.

Acting Governor Gleason Before the Supreme Court—The Trouble in the Republican Camp—Opposition to the Colored Congressional Candidate.

TALLAHASSEE, Nov. 19, 1868.

At the meeting of the Supreme Court this morning Judges Hart and Westcott were present. Information against Lieutenant Governor Gleason was filed and a rule was ordered, returnable on Tuesday next, calling on Gleason to show why a writ of quo warranto should not be issued on application. This will bring the case before the Supreme Court, when its merits will probably be fully ventilated.
