CALIFORNIA.

SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 24, 1899. About 400 Chinese women arrived at the steamship China. They were taken from the ship under a guard of the police to places designated by the headmen. An effort was made to seize some of them, and some of the rival parties were wounded. The police prevented a general fight. Great excitement exists in the Chinese quarters of the city and several arrests have been made.
