The increasing activity of money and the scarcity of funds with the banks were reflected to-day in a general advance in the rates paid for interest, the prevailing figure being seven per cent in gold, even to the lowest houses, while in cases of firms where the pledges were miscellaneous or inferior collateral, commissions of a thirty-second, a sixteenth and even an eighth were paid in addition to the legal rate.

The weekly statement of the associated banks is unfavorable on the whole, although the decrease in legal tenders is much less than expected, and shows that the shipments of currency from the Southern cities have been merely set in, however, so that it will not be safe to calculate upon as favorable a state of things next week.
