Meeting of the Cabinet.

This being the regular Cabinet day, all the members were present.

Early Election in Virginia to be Ordered.

The present understanding is that President Grant, under authority of law, will issue a proclamation at an early day submitting to the people of Virginia the constitution of that State, with separate notes on the clauses—first, as to disfranchisement; second, the test oath, and third, the county organizations.

It is understood that the vote is to be ordered for the fourth Tuesday of May next. A new registration of voters will be made. Colonel Joseph Segar has announced himself as a candidate at large for Congress in that State.

The Adjournment of the Senate—The House Securing the Spoils.

As soon as the Senate met to-day Senator Edmunds offered a resolution that the Senate adjourn to-morrow (Saturday), at five o'clock P. M.

Objection being made it went over for one day. It will come up the first thing to-morrow for consideration. The indications are that it will be defeated, as there is no prospect of the Senate getting through with its business by that time. It is the opinion of the presiding officer of the Senate, Mr. Anthony, and others that an adjournment cannot be had before Wednesday or Thursday next.

Some of the Senators are anxious to adjourn without confining all the nominations, or filling all the offices. They argue that while they are compelled to remain at the Capitol, the members of the House, scores of whom are still here, are going round to the departments and having interviews with the President, by which they get all the fat places over the heads of the Senators, without even consulting them.

If the Senators were disengaged, like the members of the House, they have an idea that they could do better by way of getting places for their friends. There is doubtless some force in this, but Grant says he would rather the Senators would attend to their legitimate business of confirming and rejecting and allow him to make the nominations.

Large Number of Nominations Confirmed.

The Senate confirmed to-day about 150 nominations of all sorts, from ministers extraordinary and plenipotentiary to petty postmasters. There were but two rejections—a pension agent at Memphis and a postmaster at Lawrence, Kansas. These are the first rejections made since Grant's inauguration.

Now that the ice is broken it is doubtful if the rejections will be limited to numerous. "In the way," say some of the dissatisfied Senators, "Grant will say to understand that the Senate has a say in this matter of appointments as well as himself." A. G. Curtin was confirmed Minister to Russia, after a slight sparring between his friends and his opponents. Although there was no call for the year and says on him his nomination was not unanimous. The only opposition Senator Cameron has made to him was to state that Curtin was not the choice of Pennsylvania; that the two Senators from that State were not consulted about his appointment, and that he was not a fit man for the place. The cases of Sanford, Minister to Spain, and Howard, Minister to China, were brought up, but, considerable opposition being developed, they were temporarily laid aside so as to go on with nominations over which there was little or no contest. As already intimated in these despatches, both these gentlemen will have difficulty in getting through. The Pacific coast men are stoutly against Howard, because he interferes with their pet, J. Ross Browne, and they claim that on account of geographical position the Pacific States should have all the Oriental foreign appointments.

Sanford's opponents are legion, and, unless there are some remarkable conversions, it is difficult to see how he will be confirmed.

Disfranchisement with the Nominations for Consuls.

The Committee on Commerce, through whose bill all the consular nominations must pass, held their first meeting to-day. The large list of nominations was taken up and considered. Old Zach Chandler, who is chairman of the committee, has a peculiar fashion of dealing with the names of those who are ambitious to represent the commercial interests of the country abroad. In his day Zach was considerable of a business man, and he has an idea that all persons who apply for consulships should have, as one of their qualifications, a business tact. Another quality indispensable with him is radicalism. Woe to the unfortunate applicant who lacks either of these requisites when he comes before Old Zach Chandler's committee! A cursory examination by the committee of the list of consuls sent in by the President reveals the fact that a large number of them are either old political hacks, incapables or democrats. Each man's merits were carefully canvassed, and after considerable discussion the committee agreed to report such as there was no contest over and to lay the others aside for further examination. The number reported favorably was comparatively few, and it looks as if Secretary Fish, who is said to have selected the list from a large number of first class applications, will have to make a recant.
