DOMINION OF CANADA.

The Trial of Caldwell—Testimony of Samuel L. Hatchford.

In the Caldwell case to-day, Samuel L. Hatchford was examined for the prosecution. He testified that the manifest of the bark Jenny, and the affidavit of the master, of date Oct. 2, 1868, were certified to by him, and were drawn up in the proper form.

Constable Bessette deposed as to the arrest of Caldwell at Prescott on the 11th of December, upon the warrant of Judge Coursol, endorsed by Patrick McCrea, Justice of the Peace of Prescott; that he was arrested in Brockville and brought to the right of a Canadian citizen, saying that he had resided two years on this side. This closed the case for the prosecution. For the defense, Flavin Crane, sister of Caldwell, deposed that she was the wife of the defendant's wife, and that she was living with him during 1867, 1868 and the two first months of 1869, in Brockville and Augustus.

Arrest Under the Extradition Treaty—Frauds in the Montreal Custom House.

J. C. Warren, Deputy United States Marshal at Boston, arrived here yesterday and arrested John O. Robinson on a charge of incendiarism committed at Summerville, Mass. The accused was arrested under the extradition treaty.
