

A PRESBYTERIAN PLEDGE.

How a Hungry Bohemian Died and Then "Chucked Out" Upon His Head—A Ritualistic Proceeding—The Rev. C. B. Smyth on Trial for Sabbath Breaking.

A solemn convocation of the clergy and elders of the United Presbyterian church was held yesterday afternoon in the Seventh avenue church, called for the purpose of investigating certain charges affecting the character of the Rev. C. B. Smyth, of the Eleventh street Presbyterian church.

The charges against Mr. Smyth are founded upon what he properly designated a disgraceful and malicious statement in the Sun of the 11th of April, on Palm Sunday morning the reverend gentleman denounced upon the McFarland case, and several other persons present at a report of the sermon.

The Rev. ROBERT AMSTRONG, clerk of the Presbytery, read the roll of members, and then the business of the day was taken up by the reading of the article of charges against Mr. Smyth.

After a long discussion upon the mode of procedure and deciding upon the formalities to be observed, it was resolved that the case should be opened to the Rev. Mr. Smyth—either to admit the truth of the remarks or to deny them, and if the latter was the case, to present a written answer to the charges.

Mr. Smyth said that when he read the article of charges and had reflected upon it for a day or two, he felt a very great reluctance to appear and asked a brother minister to join with him in making a meeting of the Presbytery, so that the facts of the case might be made known to the members of the church.
