

FINANCIAL AND COMMERCIAL.

The decline in gold unsettled the government market, and prices before and at the board were the lowest made in some months, the 67's selling at 112 1/2. These figures brought in investors who were waiting for a decline in order to buy, and the market rallied especially, as gold also advanced, but the sales on foreign account checked the returning buoyancy, and prices were only about steady at the close.

The foreign exchanges were stronger and active, large sales occurring soon after the departure of the steamers. It seems that the firmness in the price of governments, as compared with gold, has presented the temptation of a small profit on sales of bonds held abroad, and hence some of the foreign bankers were selling five-twelves, intending to follow for delivery until the arrival of the bonds ordered from Europe, and for which they will pay with bills of exchange bought to-day.

The Southern list was dull, except for the Tennessee, which were moderately active and strong, for both the old and new issues, on reports from the State Legislature that the present temper of members is strongly opposed to any sort of degree of repudiation. The new Louisiana six per cent loan has been placed in London at 12 1/2 per cent. The gold market has been firmer to-day, although the earliest price was 111, the lowest since March. The opportunity to cover outstanding speculative sales has been taken advantage of by many who have been waiting for the turn of the market to rise, while the merchants have also bought largely to remit to Europe. The effect of these influences was a rise of a quarter per cent—viz., to 111 1/2—at which the market closed strong this evening, the large shipment of specie by to-day's steamers assisting its firmer tone. The gold loan market 1-32 and 1-64 to Monday afternoon were the rates for borrowing in transactions for the clearing of the clearing house. The operations of the Gold Exchange Bank were as follows:—

The money market was without change, and easy at three to five per cent on call loans. The prevailing rate on governments was three per cent and on stocks four. Commercial paper was reported a little firmer for the longer dates, which are likely to overtake the interval to the advent of active money in the fall.

The weekly statement of the associated banks shows a loss in reserve of a million and a half of dollars, including a decrease of about a million legal tenders. The deposits have fallen of two and a half millions, so that the surplus reserve has decreased less than a million. The banks have increased their loans about three hundred thousand dollars. It would seem, from the statements of the past few weeks, that the banks have passed the climax of their expansion, and that the slow movement which is now making of the old grain crop, together with the prospective demand for money in connection with the new one, will entail a steady drain of irregular and varying proportions upon their resources until the crop movement ceases.
