

MEXICO.

Peacefully inclined—The Candidates for the Presidency—The Free Zone and Amnesty Questions—Freedom of the Press—The Tehuantepec Expedition—Railroad Concessions.

MEXICO, Nov. 23, 1870. The peaceful condition of the country at this time is rather remarkable, when the fact is taken into consideration that the Amnesty law recently passed has placed at full liberty a very large number of military aspirants who have for the past two years been fighting so prominently as revolutionary disturbers, and who have drawn so heavily upon the impoverished resources of the country and have occasioned such misery and bloodshed. The people are dissatisfied in several States, and especially in Guerrero, Jalisco, San Luis Potosi and Puebla, but seem to prefer to suffer their wrongs, real or imaginary, rather than resort to revolutionary acts. It may prove to be the calm before the raging storm, but all well wishers for Mexico hope it is a real respite, and that the amnesty law, together with a healthy conviction of the people themselves that matters cannot be improved by an appeal to arms.

The three prominent candidates for the Presidency—Juarez, Lerdo and Porfirio Diaz—are supposed to be marshaling their forces and discovering who are their friends; clubs are being formed in all parts of the country for the presentation of the claims of the various candidates; but so far no extraordinary demonstrations have been made. Many persons profess to believe that President Juarez will retire from the field.

The President has recently passed upon the recommendation of the Executive Council, and its confirmation and eventual extension by the large vote of eighty-five to thirty-seven, was a victory which has alarmed many intelligent Mexicans. The press continues to discuss the bill and propose various effects of its passage at home, but has not yet referred to the views which may be taken of it abroad. There is every reason to believe that the Executive will accede to his expressed desire to see the "zone" abolished, and will undoubtedly withhold the bill and his observations upon it till the end of the session, so that its final discussion will be postponed until the spring meeting of Congress.

The freedom of the press has just been exemplified by the arbitrary imprisonment, in a dirty dungeon, of the editor of one of the city papers who refused to comment upon certain wrongs charged against the City Council. It was an act of a total disregard for the rights of the citizen, and there is reason to believe that the latter will not sanction the measure.

United States exploring expedition has reached the Isthmus, and is awaiting the arrival from this city of the Commissioners who are to discuss the Mexican government. The latter have been appointed and are in number. They left here last week for the Isthmus.

The expedition of the Tehuantepec Railroad Company is expected to be completed in a few days. The construction of three lines of railroad—one from Vera Cruz to some point on the proposed line of the Tehuantepec Railroad, passing by the way of Anton Lizardo, another from the above first line to Cuernavaca, and the third from Cuernavaca, or some point on the line, to Washington.
