THE KU KLUX.

Ku Kluxism in South Carolina at a Discount.

Proclamation by the President Restoring the Privileges of the Writ of Habeas Corpus in Marion County, O.—The Ku Klux in Union County Taken in Hand.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 3, 1871.

The President this morning issued the following proclamation, correcting a mistake in his former proclamation suspending the privileges of the writ of habeas corpus in certain counties in South Carolina:

THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA—A PROCLAMATION.

Whereas, in my proclamation of the 12th day of October, in the year 1871, it was recited that certain unlawful combinations and conspiracies existed in certain counties in the State of South Carolina for the purpose of depriving certain portions and classes of the people of the rights, privileges, immunities and protection named in the constitution of the United States, and secured by the act of Congress approved April 20, 1871, entitled "An act to enforce the provisions of the fourteenth amendment to the constitution of the United States," and whereas, it was recited that the said combinations and conspiracies were enjoined to disperse and retire peaceably to their homes within five days from said date:

And whereas, by my proclamation of the 17th day of October, 1871, the privileges of the writ of habeas corpus were suspended in the counties named in said proclamation:

And whereas the county of Marion was named in said proclamation as one of the counties in which said unlawful combinations and conspiracies for the purposes aforesaid existed, and in which the privileges of the writ of habeas corpus were suspended:

And whereas it has been ascertained that the said unlawful combinations and conspiracies do not exist to the extent recited in said proclamation:

Now, therefore, I, Ulysses S. Grant, President of the United States of America, do hereby suspend the said suspension of the writ of habeas corpus, directed in my said proclamation of the 17th day of October, 1871, in the county of Marion, in the State of South Carolina, in all persons in the said county of Union, composing the said unlawful combinations and conspiracies, and in all persons who are connected with or controlled by them for carrying out the unlawful purposes for which the combinations and conspiracies are organized.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and caused the seal of the United States to be hereunto affixed, at the City of Washington, this 30 day of October, 1871.
