LAND GRANTS AND SUBSIDIES.

COLUMBUS, Ohio, March 8, 1872.

A resolution was adopted in the senate to-day asking the Ohio congressmen to use their influence to secure the passage of a joint resolution declaring the true construction of the statute of March 31, 1857, or the enactment of a special statute similar to the Mason act, securing to Ohio the cash balance of five per centum of the net proceeds of the sales of the public lands within the limits, as provided in the Ohio Enabling act, approved March 3, 1852.

JUDGE RICHARDSON'S RETURN HOME.

Seventy-five Million Dollars' Worth of Bonds Ready for Transportation to Washington.

THE ALABAMA CLAIMS AGITATION.

Judge Richardson, of the Treasury Department, is just closing up his office here, at which all the operations with the now famous Syndicate have been completed, and is sending home plethoric boxes stuffed with \$75,000,000 worth of dead bonds, which have been bought and cancelled in virtue of the issue of a like sum of the new loan at lower interest.

THE BONDS TO BE RETURNED.

As the money was received from time to time in exchange for the bonds delivered this money was again to be expended in the purchase of bonds to be returned.

NEW BONDS AND OLD.
