

THE COURTS.

THE OPERATOR SURRENDERING HIMSELF TO THE POLICE. The Operator Surrendering Himself to the Police. A tall, gentlemanly looking man, named Albert Van Saun, surrendered himself yesterday to Captain Irving, of the detective police, under peculiar circumstances. Van Saun carried on business some time in the basement of No. 18 Broad street, and during this time the forger with which he is charged was committed. Shortly after the commission of the deed Van Saun, it is claimed, disappeared, and a reward of \$10,000 was offered for his apprehension. F. H. Smith, of 34 Broad street, upon whom the forgery was made, reported the case to Superintendent Keiso, and that gentleman instructed Captain Irving to detail Detective Tilley to work with Detective Sampson, the latter being in charge of the case, and endeavor to bring it to a successful issue. The crime was committed on the 24th of August, 1871, on which day Van Saun, it is alleged, presented his own check for \$50,000.
