Mrs. Meyer and Mrs. Dodd came into contact on Friday evening, and while tussling in the hallway Meyer came to the assistance of his wife. Mrs. Dodd retreated in good order to her own room, but Meyer followed and stabbed her twice in the head with a pocket knife, inflicting severe but not dangerous wounds. Dodd, who was working in the street, saw Meyer and rushed up to the second floor to Mrs. Dodd's assistance. He was met at the head of the stairs by Meyer, who aimed a blow for the purpose of driving Dodd off with his left forearm, which the knife penetrated, cutting a deep gash several inches in length. A struggle then ensued for the possession of the knife, which was stopped by the arrival of a policeman, who arrested Meyer. Justice Bixby committed him for trial at the General Sessions without bail.
