EDWINTON, D. T., NORTH PACIFIC RAILROAD, Oct. 13, 1872.

Owing to the disposition on the part of the commanding officer of the expedition to suppress all news of hostile activity, it has been impossible to communicate existing intelligence of the doings of the Sioux recently, on the west bank of the river, in the "land of the Dakotas." A few days since the hostile Sioux warriors, to the number of 150, screened themselves in a ravine about a mile west of Fort McKean.

Another Indian Fight—The Sioux Driven Back with Six Killed.

EDWINTON, D. T., Oct. 16, 1872.

Before there was an opportunity to send this report there occurred at Fort McKean another Indian fight. Day before yesterday, the 14th instant, a small wagon train was sent out for logs for building material for the post, about a mile distant, under the escort of about twenty soldiers, where the party discovered a large party of Indians in a canyon called "L. e.," the train were driven so close to a circle, one in rear of the other, in a manner, so as to bring all the miles within the ring, thereby furnishing a barricade for the troops and a yard for the safety of the animals—a maneuver well understood by freighters and plainmen.

By this time the garrison was under arms and a company of infantry and the scouts, numbering about thirty in all, had hastened to the relief of the endangered party. The Sioux commenced, which lasted about an hour. The Indians, according to the report of the post commander, numbered about one hundred and fifty. The enemy occupied the high ground, and the garrison was lit, though one had the heel of his shoe shot off in rather a singular manner. Since the fight the birds have been fired by the garrison, and the result was a most destructive element; the wind blowing so violently that the fire would keep pace, in places where the grass was tall, with a running fire; and the Post, which was great, was scattered, and the time was saved by the settling of counter fires, which were kept under control by the use of wet grain sacks.
