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PICTURES OF POVERTY.

Four Hundred of the Hungry in Line—What Merchants Did Who Saw the Sight—Consumption—Eight Hundred Cakes Received and Distributed—Details of Destitution from the Notes of Visitors.

St. John's Guild was the recipient of several donations on Saturday which were unexpected. During the morning a number of merchants who had occasion to visit the great freight depot opposite the chapel or to pass through Varick street noticed a long line of men, women and children in front of the Guild office.

By ten o'clock the first line had been furnished with provisions and dismissed; but new lines continually formed till noon, when they came in groups, and were aligned inside the vestibule.

The representation was excellent, and the proceeds were \$9,000 for charitable purposes.

AMERICAN COMMERCE.

Decrease of the Aggregate Tonnage of Our Shipping since 1872—Statistics of Exports and Imports.

WASHINGTON, March 8, 1874. Monthly Report No. 4 of the Bureau of Statistics now in press, contains the statistics of our foreign trade for the month ending October 31, 1873, and for the nine months ending at the same period, as compared with the corresponding time of 1872.

The portions of the imports and exports for the nine months ending October 31, 1873 and 1872, which consisted of specie and bullion, and of merchandise, respectively were as follows:—

An examination of the foregoing table shows that the total value of the imports for the nine months ending October 31, 1873, only 25 per cent was in American vessels, and for the corresponding period of 1872, 22 per cent was carried in American vessels.

In addition to the usual summaries, this report contains a table showing the value of our exports and imports of the United States (distinguishing specie and bullion from merchandise) annually, from 1850 to 1873 inclusive.
