WILLIAM M. TWEED. Motion to Quash the Indictments—Argument of Counsel.

JUDGE BRADY RESERVES OPINION. Additional Facts and Figures Presented.

Another phase of the ex-Boss Tweed's transgression of the maxim, "The way of the transgressor is hard," came up in Oyer and Terminer yesterday, before Judge Brady, on a motion brought by his counsel to quash the indictments still threatening him in connection with his acts as Chairman of the Board of Auditors. There was a pretty large attendance at the opening of the court, but as the ex-Boss himself was not present, and the points on which the indictments were most uninteresting kind, the clos of the proceedings saw very few present. Mr. Tweed was represented by counsel in the persons of Messrs. David Dudley Field, Dudley Field and Riechman. William M. Tweed, Jr., was present to the end. The people, who by legal parance are supposed to be the prosecutors, were represented by District Attorney Phelps and Mr. Peckham.

Mr. Dudley Field opened the proceedings by submitting his points, in a printed form, and speaking very briefly on the motion to quash.
