JEALOUS VAGARIES.

"I Suppose I'll Have to Die for Him."

The vagaries of love and jealousy received another pointed and terrible illustration on Sunday morning last in the cruel and cold-blooded murder of Private Peter Alberts, of Company E, Battalion of Engineers, at West Point, by his old "chum" and comrade in the same company, Michael Tobin. The story of the murder and of its surrounding circumstances is an extraordinary one in many respects.

THE STORY OF THE MURDER.

Michael Tobin had lived for some years with a widow, Ellen McGrath, at Highland Falls, N. Y., which is about five miles from West Point. He is a second class private in the army. According to the report of the coroner he was married to the woman about three years ago, in St. Joseph's Church, this city, but this is generally doubted by those at West Point who claim to know the facts.
