Expedition in Mesopotamian Wines in Artillery Battle.

LONDON, July 13.—The British expedition in Mesopotamia is still at Sanjayat, about fifteen miles below Kut-el-Amara, on the Tigris, according to an official statement issued to-day.

Gen. Lake, the commander at Sanjayat, made several ineffective efforts to reach the beleaguered garrison. The number of men in his command is unknown. Sanjayat is about 105 miles from Bagdad.
