

\$1,712,522.70 MORE ASKED IN BUDGET

But Some City Departments Request \$187,943.64 Less Than This Year.

INCREASE IS \$1,574,579.06

Pruning of Estimates Will Come Before Measure Is Put Through.

Estimates of various city departments for the 1917 budget show a net increase over the 1916 budget allowance of \$1,574,579.06.

These early estimates are not necessarily what the departments will get when the 1917 budget is drawn.

The Board of Child Welfare asks the largest increase. This year its allowance was \$481,802.50, for 1917 it asks \$1,303,710, an increase of \$821,907.50.

Commissioner Burdett G. Lewis would like \$1,709,580.10 to run the department of Correction in 1917.

The Bronx \$1,484,006.02. The largest salary increase asked is for Chief H. Smith, chief engineer of the Department of Water Supply.
