Purcell's victim in the final yesterday afternoon was George M. Ivory, the golfer who surprised every one, including himself, by making a 68 in one of his matches on Thursday.

Ivory made a good fight of it all of the way to the turn, although he was up only once at the third, Purcell leading by one or two holes most of the way.
