National League President Orders Manager of Giants and Hempstead, Club Owner, to Report for Conference on Brooklyn Incident.

Despite the fact that most fans are of the opinion that McGraw's red-hot statement in the last week of the National League season, charging his players with indifference in the last Giant-Brooklyn series, is dead, embalmed and buried, it is not exactly the case. John K. Tener, president of the National League, said at the time that John J. McGraw would not be investigated. He blamed it on the "trial" in McGraw, which had been stirred up by watching the Giants play poor ball after their sensational start in winning twenty-six straight games.

However, McGraw's statement, which put the finish of the National League under a cloud, was placed in the closet only until after the world's series and will be brought out for an airing some time this week. Tener moves quietly, and has suave ways, but he was more aroused over the McGraw incident than appeared on the surface. When McGraw was asked what he meant when he left the bench in a rage and exclaimed, "I have worked too hard all season to stand for that kind of playing, and I will not be a party to it," it was originally intended to have the three cornered conference a secret, but secrets will get out.
