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DOCTORS AGAINST BIRTH CONTROL

New York County Medical Society Refuses to Indorse Subject.

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The New York County Medical Society turned down birth control last night by a vote of 210 to 73 after a stormy session in Hoanck Hall, 17 West Forty-third street. The vote was on the adoption of the majority report of a committee against the society going on record as in favor of an amendment to record 1142 of the Penal Law, which prohibits physicians giving birth control information.
