ITALY TO SEEK A SHARE

ROME, April 7.—Italy is keenly interested in the financial aid it is understood the United States purposes extending to England and France. It has been decided in this connection to the attention of the American Government to the situation with regard to Italy, and to-day Thomas Nelson Page, the American Ambassador, was requested to bring to the notice of the State Department the fact that while Italy was making 40 per cent. of her war purchases in the United States to an amount estimated to reach \$500,000,000 this year, so far only a \$25,000,000 credit loan has been extended to her, this fact resulting in the serious depreciation of her money to the extent of 40 per cent.

BRAZIL'S NAVY GOOD
