German Pacifists Offer Peace Plan. AMSTERDAM, via London, May 4. 6:35 A. M.—Four German pacifist organizations have petitioned the Reichstag to accept the following principles in view of the new situation created by the Russian revolution: First, Germany to make peace with Russia without territorial acquisition, but under a guarantee that the national rights of Germans in Russia be respected; second, Germany's peace terms in respect to her other enemies to be disclosed; third, the promotion of peace by a union of the nations and the reduction of armaments; fourth, internal reorganization based on the will and needs of the German people.
