

BRITISH TROOPS PUSHING FORWARD

Advance on Belgian Front South of Ypres Reported by Gen. Haig.

TAKE GERMAN PRISONERS

Berlin Says Attack on Arras Front Beyond Monchy Ridge Was Repulsed.

LONDON, June 16.—The forward movement of the British troops on the Belgian front south of Ypres continued today, Field Marshal Haig reported tonight.

During the night the British were successful on the same front in repulsing a strong German counter attack made after heavy artillery fire on the Ypres Canal to the southeast of the city of Ypres.

On the French front the artillery has become more active, hitting the German positions before ordering a resumption of the offensive.

British Night Statement.—During the day fighting has again taken place in a sector of the Hindenburg line northwest of Bullecourt.

The artillery activity on both sides has continued at intervals throughout the day.

Particularly successful work was done by our airplanes yesterday, both in cooperation with our artillery and in reconnaissance work and bombing raids.

As a result of the fighting six German airplanes were brought down, one falling in our line and other enemy machines were driven down out of control.

French Night Statement.—Artillery duels were quite violent north and south of the Ailette River as well as in Champagne, in the sector of Carnillet and Mont Blond.

Belgian Statement.—There was slight artillery activity on the Belgian front except near Steenstraete and Het Sas, where it was quite lively last night.

French Day Statement.—We repulsed several enemy attacks against our small posts near Hill 204, on the heights of the Meuse, and east of Badonviller. French troops pen-

BATTLE 11,115 FEET UP WON BY ITALIANS

Alpini and Men on Skis Storm Garrison Under Heavy Fire and Carry It.

LONDON, June 16.—Italian Alpini and other troops on skis performed a remarkable exploit yesterday in storming the Corvo Cavento, a mountain peak 11,115 feet in height in the icebound mountains of the western Trentino.

At several places on the Artois front skidrom movements developed. After their failure of Thursday evening the British again attacked yesterday morning east of Loos.

Along the Aisne and in the western part of the Champagne the artillery fire increased considerably during the evening and remained lively at several places during the night.

Reconnoitering advances on the Lorraine plain resulted in the capture of a number of prisoners.

PORK BILL SHUNTED FOR FOOD MEASURE

Displaced in House After Its Advocates Overturn Chair's Ruling.

WASHINGTON, June 16.—The river and harbor bill was temporarily displaced in the House today when adjournment was taken until Monday.

The point of order was premised upon the proposition that the item involved a canal and should be passed on by the Committee on Railways and Canals.

Later, to the great joy of the Southern "hog" combination, the \$20,000 item for the Congress river was raised to \$50,000 over the nominal protest of the Rivers and Harbors Committee.

German Ship Torpedoed.—LONDON, June 16.—The German steamship Thuringen, which has been plying regularly between Hamburg and Rotterdam, was torpedoed Thursday off Ter-schelling and sank, says an Exchange Telegraph despatch from Ymuiden today.

HEAD OF CAPUCHINS HERE

Most Rev. Venance de Lisle-Rigault to Visit Provinces.

A steamship arriving in this port yesterday brought, in addition to the Belgian War Commissioners, the Most Rev. Venance de Lisle-Rigault, general of the Capuchin Order, who comes from Rome for the first time in twenty years to visit the Capuchin provinces in North America.

A. W. Berner, who spent six months in Spain and Portugal and had seen no indications of a revolutionary movement in King Alfonso's land, was another passenger. Also on board was James Burwell, American Vice-Consul at St. Gall, Switzerland, who said the embroidery industry in Switzerland was crippled because of the inability to obtain thread from England.

Italian.—East of the Adamello massif in the western Trentino, Alpine detachments of the Val Baiton battalion and skiers advanced over very difficult ground notwithstanding the furious resistance of the enemy and attacked the strongly fortified positions on Corvo Cavento at an altitude of 3,400 meters.

On the front of the Asiago Plateau the enemy artillery continued to show great activity. Patrol attacks on our positions on Mount Zebio were repulsed.

On the Ortigara at dawn yesterday our positions on Hill 2101 were again attacked with extreme violence. From 2:30 o'clock onward the enemy, continually reinforced, redoubled his efforts, but they all failed in the face of our firm resistance.

Austrian.—There is nothing important to report from the Isonzo army. In Carinthia the enemy artillery fire has increased in the Ploekken sector with the greatest violence.

CONGRESS PUTS ON NEW WAR PRESSURE

The country will not only respond to your appeal and accept the pledge to the food administration which you are proposing, but that all men also who are engaged in the personal distribution of goods will cooperate with the same earnestness and in the same spirit.

In its original form the Newlands priority shipment bill, passed unanimously by the Senate today, gave the President an absolute control of the common carrier service of the nation, both by land and by water.

Section 2.—That during the continuance of the war in which the United States is now engaged the President is authorized, whenever in his judgment such action is necessary to the public security and defense, to direct that certain kinds of traffic or particular shipments as may be determined by him shall have preference or priority in transportation by any common carrier by railroad or water under such arrangements, rules and regulations as he may prescribe.

AMSTERDAM, via London, June 16.—Riots have broken out in several German towns yesterday, says the newspaper Nieuwe Rotterdamse Courant today.

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
