The policemen and deputies remained downstairs, but the Sheriff bounded up the steps. He reached Mr. Dooling's room as Afton Means and his deputy entered. Afton Means said that the Sheriff did not know how the Sheriff seemingly didn't know how the Sheriff blustered and demanded that the papers be given up. Mr. Dooling coolly told him there would be no surrender, on his or the part of any one associated with him.

Refuse to Give Up Weapons.
