

BROOKLYN RALLIES TO MITCHEL'S SIDE

Four Big Meetings Assure Him of Growing Strength in the Borough.

AGAIN SCORES TAMMANY Takes Hyman to Task for Budget Criticism and Shows Him in Error.

Brooklyn last night gave Mayor Mitchell a welcome which was so hearty that political seers now are ready to take back the predictions they had made earlier as to the number of votes he would poll in that borough.

The Mayor in his addresses spoke with characteristic informality of the Hearst-Murphy un-Americanism, and replied to criticism from the press with a freedom of expression that has not been known in the past administration.

HUGHES TELLS WHY HE IS FOR MITCHEL

Ex-Governor Makes His First Speech for Mayor Before 3,000 in Brooklyn.

Nearly three thousand persons crowded into Kismet Temple, 614 Park street, Brooklyn, last night to hear Charles Evans Hughes, Republican candidate for President at the last national election, make his first speech in support of Mayor John Purroy Mitchell during the present campaign.

Mr. Hughes devoted practically all of his address to a discussion of the reasons why he is supporting Mayor Mitchell in his fight for reelection and in dissecting and exposing the claims of Tammany Hall that it stands or ever has stood for decent municipal government.
