

SCHMITZBERGER OF POLICE FAME DIES IN PEACE

Inspector, Who Served on Force 43 Years, Had Stormy Career.

STRICKEN WHEN ON DUTY Spurned for Lexow Revelations, He Won Back Esteem and Gained High Rank.

Max F. Schmitzberger, chief inspector of the police department and for forty-three years a member of the New York force, died last night at 6:40 o'clock in his home at 237 East Sixty-first street. His death was caused by pneumonia, which developed from a cold contracted last Thursday.

Chief Schmitzberger had been ill since two months ago, when he was stricken at his desk. He received a sixty day leave of absence and recovered his strength with such rapidity that he felt able to walk over to Fifth avenue to watch the Liberty parade. A few hours later a cold developed and pneumonia, and from that time on his physicians held out little hope for his life.

For several hours before his death Chief Schmitzberger was unconscious, and the end was peaceful. At his bedside were his daughter, Miss Anna Schmitzberger, and his sons, William, George, Max, Frank, Oswald and Warner.

Max Schmitzberger's long police record dropped, for a time at least, just as far down as it later climbed high—and he climbed to the highest pinnacle possible for the record of a uniformed member of the force to reach. Mixed with the medals and the dinners they gave him were maledictions and mud; but once he had started out on his career, which the underworld he prosecuted would term "turning straight" he hiked steadily onward up the path to a place so high, morally and professionally, that in the end the Devil and Tammanyites and the rest who denounced him had to rehash ancient history to a wondering present generation of Schmitzberger admirers in order to get any kind of hearing.

When, one day in December, 1874, Schmitzberger, then a captain, stepped down from the record of a uniformed member of the Lexow investigation, his head bowed with the shameful story of graft which he had just confessed to an astounded assemblage, he was regarded by some as a man who had turned his back on his home and tottered toward his bed. For a time he stayed there, broken down for good, out. And that was back in the days when the police department was a place where a man could get a job and stay there for the rest of his life. It was not until the year 1890 that Schmitzberger was able to leave his bed and again with a new resolve to show the community that his confession was a sincere one and that he meant to redeem himself.

Reform Efforts Superhuman. Dr. Parkhurst in time was won over by Schmitzberger's efforts. And straightaway Schmitzberger set a firm face toward his enemies and started in to make good. Never was there so exemplary a policeman. The work he had done out of the back of his mind, in the circumstances, superhuman. But how wonderfully he succeeded is evident to a great city which in late years has come to prize a man who has done his duty.

Retrieved Himself Gloriously. But Schmitzberger, once he had "gone straight" kept on going. He went on with a dogged determination to retrieve himself that was characteristic, and he died gloriously with professional honor as everybody knows how Charley Becker did.

He came from immediate home surroundings that were intellectually above those from which his brother rookies who joined the force with him back in the '70s had sprung. His father, the late George C. Schmitzberger, before coming from Bavaria to New York, had been a lawyer in Germany, had served with distinction in the army of King Otto of Greece—during which time he had won the cross of St. George—and had been a town for four days—had mastered seven languages and was a respected teacher of languages in Newark Academy up to the time of his death. His son, christened Maximilian, was born in Bavaria on July 27, 1821, and was brought to Newark from Germany by his father. He was a sailor, and when he was 14 he ran away to sea on the schooner Three Brothers. But a port on the Connecticut coast was reached, and he came ashore. He came back to Manhattan, where he worked in various shops, finally taking up the candy-making trade until just after he became of age an ambition to become one of New York's finest gripped him.

SEVEN STOR BLAZE BURNS OUT 30 FIRMS

Two Top Floors of Electrical Exchange in Washington Street Swept.

ELEVATOR MEN FAITHFUL They Stick to Post Until 150 Trapped Employees Are Brought to Safety.

A spectacular two hour fire consumed the offices and storerooms of thirty firms on the sixth and top floors of the seven story Electrical Exchange Building, bounded by Liberty, Washington and Cedar streets, last yesterday afternoon. The loss was estimated by firemen at \$100,000. Three alarms and an extra call for an additional water tower were necessary before the flames were subdued. Two elevator operators, Charles Levy and Joseph Cudo, who ran the elevators until the 160 employees were safely carried to the street, and the brave fight of a group of firemen on the sixth floor fire escape on the Washington street side of the building provided thrills for the crowds from lower Broadway.

The fire started about 5:30 o'clock, William Watts, superintendent of the building, believes it originated in the office of R. W. Rehan Brothers, novelty dealers, on the seventh floor. The building, which was under construction for the use of large firms, had been occupied by a number of small firms, which necessitated the installation of elevators. Locked doors and doors without handles baffled the firemen in their efforts to check the spread of the flames.

Blazing Corridors Inside. When the firemen reached the building flames were leaping from the top floor windows on the Cedar street side. Two water towers were raised and within a few minutes the center of the structure was a cauldron of leaping flames. The fire broke through the roof and gave passage to the entire lower North River front was ablaze. At the first alarm the two elevator boys sent their cars to the top floor and down, refusing to heed the hysterical cries of women on the lower floors until the girls employed on the two topmost floors were rescued. The firemen, who were safely in the street it was not difficult to transport those who had been delayed from leaving the lower floors by a desire to save valuables.

Two Firemen Injured. For the most part the offices and rooms on the two floors gutted by fire were occupied by firms doing a variety of goods, novelties and cheap jewelry. Two firemen were forced to leave the building for a few moments because of the heat and smoke. One of them, John P. Springer and John P. Dunn, suffered lacerations of the hands from broken glass.


