French Chamber of Deputies by 418 to 65 Supports New Government.

81,850,000,000 FOR WAR

Premier in Address Declares Nation's Power to Bring Forth Victory.

PARIS, Nov. 20.—After Premier Clemenceau had read an address in which he stated the purposes and aims of the new Government, the Chamber of Deputies this evening gave him a vote of confidence, 418 to 65.

The new Cabinet to-day approved the bill prepared by Louis Kloz, Minister of Finance, appropriating 8,263,000,000 francs (about \$1,850,000,000) for war expenses during the first quarter of 1918 and it will be introduced in the Chamber of Deputies to-morrow.
