

COURT TAKES HOLD TO CHECK DOOLING

Orders Sheriff Within the Bar to Restrain Clashes at Trial of Means.

REPRIMAND FROM BENCH

New York Assistant Prosecutor Draws Mocking Laugh by His Questions.

CONCORD, N. C., Dec. 8.—Clashes between lawyers at the trial of Gaston B. Means for the murder of Mrs. Maude A. King reached such a point today that the court ordered the sheriff to remain within the bar.

The vigor with which John T. Dooling, assistant district attorney of New York county, conducted the cross-examination of Means brought protests from the defendant's lawyers and a reprimand from the court.

At the start this morning Judge Cline had issued an attitude of positiveness and he made it clear that the rules for the day would be "question-answer-ruling."

The cross-examination brought out little of special interest during the first few hours, and the examination itself was overshadowed in interest by the tenaciousness of the situation.

Housewives Pay Fancy Prices for Inferior Goods.

Many cold storage eggs are being sold to housewives at fresh egg prices, and the consumers think they are really getting the money's worth.

Out in Davenport, Ia., nine carloads of eggs were sold recently at 34 cents a dozen. On the same day cold storage eggs were sold at wholesale in this city at 32 to 33 cents a dozen.

The price of the Iowa eggs indicates that they came out of a freezer.

"These eggs are like them," Mr. Foy said last evening, "are some mixed with fresh eggs that are collected at the various crossroads in the State. They are eggs that were put in cold storage in the summertime, when eggs are not at their best.

There is no law that prohibits the sale of cold storage eggs as fresh eggs, and the State Commissioner of Agriculture is not being obeyed by everybody.

Williams Tells City Club What Food Administration Is Doing.

Talks on food control and public markets followed dinner at the Saturday luncheon of the City Club, 55 West Forty-fourth street, yesterday afternoon.

Arthur Williams, Federal Food Administrator for this city, said the agricultural situation in France is a deplorable condition and the United States will have to look to providing foodstuffs for the Allies.

"Even in the matter of tobacco," he said, "the United States must supply the soldiers as well as the soldiers of France."

Mr. Williams told some of the things the Food Administration is trying to do, and explained that the use of most has fallen off 10 per cent in New York city merely as the result of an appeal to the people.

John Mitchell, chairman of the Federal Food Board and head of the State Food Commission, said that for a time he had been in New York city, and found that the people were not clashing as to jurisdiction, but the situation has been clarified and now all are working together in union.

"We must consume less in our country," he said, "or our soldiers and those of the Allies will not be able to go over the top. There is perfect understanding among the boards and we need the help of the people."
