



HINDENBURG LINE IN THE CAMBRAI



Moving forward into action. Just a little beyond this point thousands of men are engaged in a death grapple while supporting columns are hurried forward. The ruined factory has only recently been wrested from the enemy.

At last the cavalry gets a chance to show what it can do. The bridge over which the horsemen are passing has been hastily thrown across a captured German trench. British troops have just "cleaned out" this section.



A German airplane brought down by the British at a point once far behind the German lines. The Tommies are taking great interest in the prize, which is very little damaged.



Main street in the village of Ribecourt, a few minutes after the Huns had taken to their heels. British soldiers are still hunting in the ruined buildings for lurking Germans. The main advance is just beyond.

These signs in the captured town of Marcoing, translated, say "From the front to Cambrai, and "To the railway station. By order of the commandant." Cambrai, incidentally, is only about three miles further on.
