

GRAIN PIT DOUBTS ROSY CAR REPORTS

Corn Market Holds Up and Oats Go to Highest Prices of Season. Chicago, Jan. 24.—Speculation regarding predictions of an increased movement of the crop ended stubbornly today to uphold the corn market. Prices closed unsettled, at 1.25 1/2 for March and 1.25 1/4 for May, with the final range varying from 1/2 cent to 1/4 cent above or below the previous day's closing.

AMERICA'S BUSINESS WITH SWISS GROWS

Record Imports of Women's Apparel and Exports of Raw Materials. Switzerland is importing more raw materials from the United States, and the United States is importing larger quantities of finished novelties in women's apparel than ever before, according to Louis Junod, Swiss Consul in New York. America's importations of Swiss embroideries have fallen to about 2 per cent from the importations of 1914, due to the increased cost of production. Straw novelties and braids, however, are being imported in larger quantities and more women's silk sweaters are coming in than previously.

Paper Waistcoats Win Popularity in England

PAPER garments to ward off the penetrating cold of the present winter and to make up for the lack of ordinary dress materials become popular with the women of England. The garment in particular favor is an under-waistcoat of thick unbleached paper pulp, placed between two layers of cloth. It is made sleeveless with the seams bound with tape, and is said to answer to the purpose in excellent fashion, especially for women who are exposed to the rigors of the weather in sport or on account of war occupations.
