

ALDERMEN DECIDE NOT TO EXPEL LEE

His Criticism of War Savings Not Sufficient Cause, Committee Finds.

Will Warn Socialists Unpatriotic Utterances in Board Meetings to Be Suppressed Hereafter.

The conclusion was reached yesterday that if Alderman Lee, Socialist leader of the Board of Aldermen, should be expelled from that body for his unpatriotic statement at the board meeting on Tuesday in regard to the war savings stamp plan, he probably would be reinstated by the courts and would return a martyr.

The committee on rules of the board, of which President Smith is chairman, considered the question for more than an hour in the office of the acting Mayor yesterday afternoon. In the absence of any ethnographic minutes showing exactly the language of the socialist, the committee tried to piece together their recollection of his words and went over the various newspaper accounts. It was agreed that Alderman Lee had been extremely careful in the way he phrased his remarks and that, while they were unpatriotic in the extreme, it probably could not be successfully held before a court that they constituted cause for expulsion.

In addition to President Smith the following members of the committee attended the meeting: Vice-Chairman Robert L. Moran, Francis P. Kenny, James R. Ferguson, J. J. O'Rourke, Samuel J. Burden and John S. O'Byrne. Alderman Adolph Held, the Socialist member of the committee, did not attend. A decision was reached that in future official minutes will be taken and that notice shall be served on the Socialists that their remarks will be watched and they will be held to strict accountability for them.

Earlier in the day a conference had been held on the subject and it was decided that so far as possible all unpatriotic utterances in the board should be suppressed. Maurice Conolly, Borough President of Queens, said that both Republicans and Democrats must unite to that end. In that sentiment Alderman Squiers, Republican, of Brooklyn, agreed. Alderman Lee only added to the irritation caused on Tuesday by issuing a statement yesterday in which he said: "There was nothing very interesting to me about yesterday's session in the Board of Aldermen. Of course I knew it was coming sooner or later. A number of the old party members who have been writing over the presence of Socialists in the board had prepared bombastic speeches of denunciation, and they had to get them off their chests. Just as the transgressor raises the cry of 'stop thief!' to divert suspicion from himself, so they wish to use the accusation of disloyalty to distract public attention from our effort to procure useful legislation."

GERMAN AIMS DEFINED

Subjugation of World Desired, Rev. Dr. Lansing Asserts.

The Rev. I. J. Lansing of Ridgewood, N. J., spoke to 500 members and guests at the Arkwright Club yesterday on "The Perils of a Premature Peace." Dr. Lansing is a member of the National Security League. He said that the purpose of Germany was nothing more or less than the subjugation of the entire world. The doctor said that the Kaiser intended holding northern France and Belgium, overrunning South America, gobbling Russia and then attacking the United States. He insisted that the Kaiser sought the absolute destruction of England.

"The financiers of Germany do not expect," he said, "that the material will pay a cent of the cost of the war, but that the subjugated nations will do so." The doctor insisted that peace overtures from Germany were only intended to gain a rest, and said that 600 German spies were at work in this country. He thought that there would be four years more of war and said that the city had recently seen a man running for Mayor "with a following of persons openly disloyal."
