WASHINGTON, June 11.—For eight hours today the sundry civil sub-committee of the House Appropriation Committee questioned George Creel, chairman of the Public Information Committee, and then asked him to return tomorrow and continue his explanation of the publicly bureau's past activities and its plans for the future.
