MILAN, June 27.—Luigi Barzini, correspondent of the *Corriere della Sera*, after a careful survey of the military situation in Italy says:

"The Austrian army tried hard, and has been beaten; but it would be a mistake to imagine the Piave defeat means that the enemy is completely disorganized and reduced to a state of impotence. The game is not over yet.

"The Austrians still have some cards to play. At least thirty of their divisions did not take part in the battle, and while they are not as good as the ones engaged they are good enough for the nucleus for an attempt at another offensive."
