SALARY RAISE VOTED FOR SOME TEACHERS

Board of Education's Schedule Is Based on Minimum of \$1,000 a Year.

WILL NEED \$1,000,000

Fear Expressed Buildings Are Used for Anti-American Meetings.

After waiting several weeks for an opinion from the Board of Estimate on proposed salary increases for teachers the Board of Education decided yesterday to authorize an addition for elementary teachers of \$50 and \$100 a year, drawing on a fund of \$300,000 on hand.

The Board of Education is now working on a schedule which it hopes to put into effect January 1, providing graduated increases throughout the system. The success of the plan will depend entirely on the disposition of the Board of Estimate to grant larger appropriations for educational purposes.

Schedule of "War Bonuses." The schedule of three "war bonuses" follows: Teachers in the elementary grades and in the first six grades of Schedules B1, B2, B3 and B4, including teachers of ungraded classes, additional compensation at the rate of \$100 a year.

Teachers in the seventh to fifteenth years in the same schedules additional compensation at the rate of \$100 a year. Assistant teachers in high schools in the first three years of Schedule F1 additional compensation at the rate of \$100 a year.

No Shortage of Teachers. Contrary to statements made some time ago that the teaching staff of the department was being depleted for war service and that a shortage of teachers in elementary grades was a danger of a shortage, the average number of new teachers appointed annually is 1,000 and there are plenty of applicants on the waiting list.
