U. S. APPROVES LOAN FOR CHINA DEFENCE

State Department Announces Policy of Cooperation With Our Bankers.

\$50,000,000 IS MENTIONED

Negotiations Under Way to Have Allies Join Equally in Lending to Republic.

WASHINGTON, July 29.—The new policy of approving loans by American bankers to China so that nation may be the better able to defend itself against enemy forces approaching its borders was announced to-day by the State Department. No specific amount of the loan was announced, but it is understood that \$50,000,000 will be advanced.

China declared war against Germany very largely because of the action of the United States. Therefore this Government has felt a special interest in the desire of China to equip herself as to be of more specific assistance in the war against the Central Powers.
