Nothing Official on Money. After a meeting of the money committee yesterday afternoon, Benjamin Strong, Jr., governor of the New York Federal Reserve Bank, said there would be no announcement made.

Southern Pacific Declines. The decline in Southern Pacific had no connection with any change in the fundamental strength of the railway nor with the report of the Federal Reserve Bank.

Wilson Financing. Wilson & Co. common did not experience any apparent effect yesterday from the report of the Federal Trade Commission.

Marine Again Erratic. The sharp drop in Marine preferred yesterday afternoon was due to the fact that the operators in this issue had not yet been investigated.

Can Strong. Talk of a possible dividend disbursement on American Can was responsible for an advance of several points in the stock yesterday.
