WANTS CONGRESS TO WELCOME SOLDIERS Independents Would Thus Avoid "Petty Questions." The Independent Citizens Committee, which is opposing the Hearst welcome for troops, appealed yesterday to the House of Representatives to take the situation by asking Congress to make appropriations for celebrations to be held under Government auspices in localities where troops are returning in large numbers.
