SHIP WORKERS TO OFFER PLAN

Will Give Vice-President Marshall Ideas for Unity in U. S. Building.

SEEK AID OF CONGRESS

Ask Cancelling of Contracts With Chinese and Japanese Yards.

PHILADELPHIA, Feb. 12.—Representatives of the shipworkers from Maine to the great lakes and the Gulf will present to Vice-President Marshall at a conference in Washington to-day a programme upon which, it is said, organized labor has agreed as far as it relates to the shipbuilding industry. This programme is embodied in resolutions adopted to-day at a convention here of the Shipbuilding Federation of the Atlantic Coast, Great Lakes and Gulf, attended by seventy-five delegates representing various allied craft and trades in industry.

Programme Briefly Stated:

To cancel immediately the pending \$2,000,000 contracts with Chinese yards and the \$100,000,000 contracts with Japanese yards, and to build the proposed vessels in American plants.

President Ebert Says Germany Will Combat Domination by Force

WEIMAR, Feb. 12.—Friedrich Ebert, President of Germany, in his speech accepting the Presidency, said: "I will administer my office not as the leader of a single party, but I belong to the Socialist party and cannot forget my origin and training. The privileges of birth already have been eliminated from politics and are being eliminated from social life. We shall combat domination by force to the utmost from whatever direction it may come. We wish to found our State only on the basis of right and on our freedom to shape our destinies at home and abroad. However harsh may be the lot threatening the German people, we do not despair of Germany's vital forces."

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
